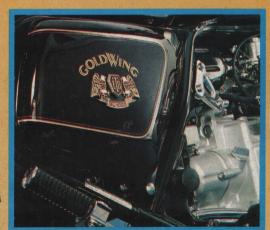

Most of us who have had a chance to ride the Yamaha TT500 or XT500 four-stroke single have fallen in love with the go-anywhere power that only a big single with

valves can give.

Sure enough, it didn't take the aftermarket boys long to come up with a bunch of bolt-on options to improve the performance and handling. What is now available brings Yamaha's 500 single from the category of outstanding to excellent for long cross-country jaunts and serious off-road competition.

The following article deals with the available goodies in two parts. A "bolt-on to your existing model in the driveway" type or Phase One and a complete Baja type offroad racer project in Phase Two. All you really need for either phase is a Yamaha 500, a fair selection of common hand tools and a checkbook. The last item should contain enough reserve funds for retaining an attorney if you are married because once you throw a leg on the 500 Yamaha with its new goodies installed, your bride will become a weekend widow.

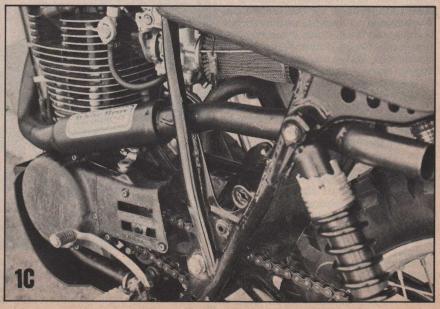
## Giving The Yamaha 500 Thumper The le-Two"

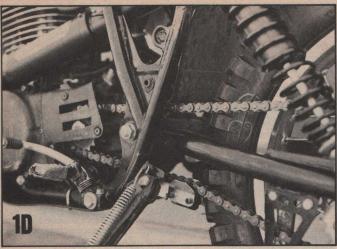

The first phase consists of the items available at press time that we were aware of. If we've failed to mention anyone who makes something trick, let us know for a follow-up. The phase one stock frame TT500 thumper weighs 15 pounds less than the original due mainly to the replacement of the standard exhaust pipe with a White Bros. high level pipe. We've also shelved the 10-pound O.E.M. shocks for a pair of S&W strokers. This is what accounted for the weight loss. To see how and what was done, follow the photo sequence.









1A Enduro-ready TT500 features 450x18 Goodyear DSII rear and Cheng Shin 350x21 six-ply rubber. A must for Baja's rocks. Author/Yamaha combo finished the tough Mexican Baja Tecate 500 two-day enduro in seventh overall and sixth in open class. Graham Sheet Metal's aluminum skid plate saved the cases. 1B Webco's VDO speedo kit includes bracket, cable, drive unit and spacers for TT500 Yamaha. Right-on accuracy with a 350x21 tire was less than 1/10th mile off after 10 miles. Route roll holder on Inter-Am aluminum bars is a must. 1C White Bros. high pipe has repackable glass silencer. Stock air box can be removed but pipe will clear standard air cleaner. K&N filter goes on standard carb fitted with a 230 main jet and



the needle raised one notch. S&W "strokers" use 95/125 springs and 14.250 eye to eye length. Best shock going for \$59.90 a pair, plus springs. 1D Chain tensioner by "Up Tite" has mild spring tension and doesn't rob hp. A must for any forward mount or lay down suspension system. Diamond 520 chain runs around CT alloy sprockets. 15-tooth in front and a 48 rear. Good for an honest 90 mph across Diablo Dry Lake. 1E White Bros. alloy swing arm and rear brake cable kit takes the hop out of hard braking on the TT500. Cable kit isolates the wheel travel from the pedal and "softens" the brake action to reduce wheel lock-up on loose surfaces. Cable stop at pedal end must be welded to frame tube.





## Phase 2

In the Phase One conversion we offered a simple solution to improving performance and handling with bolton equipment that was fairly easy to do. With the Phase Two setup, we've done just about everything possible to assemble the ultimate off-road fourstroke. The foundation starts with a C&J chrome-moly heliarc jig-welded frame that can claim just about every major motorcycle off-road race since the company began four years ago. Because we're using as many stock Yamaha parts as possible, the construction doesn't require special equipment or excessive welding. The Phase Two assembly can be done in your garage with hand tools, but does require a more advanced "home mechanic" to do the job right. All the parts are available by mail order from a retail dealer or at your local motorcycle shop. The following photos show what's necessary and how to do it.

2A Trick thumper uses Yamaha YZ400 forks and wheels, TT500 aluminum gas tank and seat. Petty "Mudder" fenders don't break and fit the C&J chrome-moly frame perfectly. Graham Sheet Metal aluminum skid plate also fits standard XT and TT500 chassis. Wet, ready-to-ride weight is 245 pounds and outa sight handling. 2B C&J owners Jeff Cole (left) and Steve Jentges (right) discuss basic frame layout with National Motocross star Jim Weinert. Geometry is Baja race proven by Bill Bell's C&J/Long Beach Honda's racing success.

2C 1976 Yamaha YZ400 forks have air tops removed, TT500 springs and additional reservoirs for 300cc Bel-Ray 20-weight fork oil capacity. Eightinch travel soaks up the Baja rocks like a sponge. Solid aluminum Inter-Am bars help with the big jolts too. 2D TT500 engine has clean-up porting, standard bore, .060-inch removed from cylinder for 10.5:1 comp ratio, Megacycle cam and springs like Rick Hocking used to win the '76 Astrodome TT National. Mikuni/Sudco 36mm carb on a Pro-Tec manifold breathes through a big K&N filter. Accel spark plug is fired by stock ignition with no problem. 2E White Bros. custom pipe is finished off by C.R. Ax-









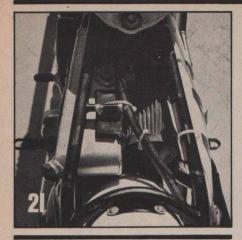




tell's Megaphone. Baja doesn't require a silencer, yet. MX400B Yamaha side covers are attached by one screw each and swing up to service air cleaner for quick pit stops. Pipe is out of the way and clears your leg. Pro-Tec neoprene overhead oil line replaces stock metalone. 2F C&J custom alloy oil tanks holds 2¾ quarts of Bel-Ray 40-weight racing oil. Tank set in rubber and has no mounting lugs to fracture. Single bolt-on top holds it snug. Engine breathes through a one-way automo-

tive PCV valve. Stock aluminum tank gives a racing range of 65 miles on 2.2 gallons. 2G White Bros. cable brake conversion and S&W's 14.250-length shocks really make a good combination for improving wheel hop. LL damping and 100-pound springs worked out best for Baja. Stock YZ wheels and rims held up okay. The XT rims won't make it; use TT500 rims instead. 2H "Up Tite" tensioner from Malcolm Smith or White Bros. guides the diamond chain. Baja 100 + mph

gearing by Circle Industries is 16-tooth in front and a 44-tooth at the rear. Bike looked like this after a hose down upon finishing 481 miles pre-running the Baja 500 race course. 21 K&N filter just fits beside custom oil tank. Mikuni carb used a 250 main jet to mix with the extra air flow. Engine breather hose is routed to rear of back fender for sanitary reasons to expel slight mist. Oil temp runs near 300 degrees for hot Baja racing, but no cooler has been needed so far.

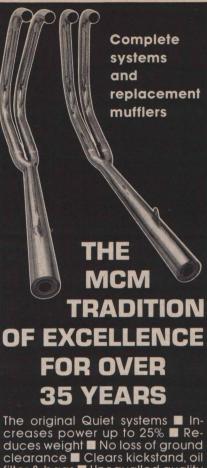
