

cameramen. "M.C." photographers travel thousands of miles
each year gathering the illustrations that complete the reports,
stories and articles we print.

Each week they turn out from their darkrooms scores of negatives and dozens of prints. From a big event such as the T.T. races, they may produce well over 1,000 shots.


Obviously, the printed page not being elastic, there is a limit to the number of pictures that can be published and a considerable quantity of photos go on file for possible future requirements. That such a rich vein of interesting and exciting material should remain virtually untapped has always seemed to me a great pity . . . couldn't a way be found to give our readers a look at some of this pictorial treasure? Why not make a collection of the best of the many thrilling action shots captured by our lensmen during the course of a typical sporting year?

Well, we have done that very thing, and this is the first of a three-part series of picture-books which we are including free with this and the next two issues of *Motor Cycling with Scooter Weekly*.

This edition covers the Spring period. The second will recapture the highlights of the Summer and the third will embrace the Autumn events up to the International Six Days Trial.

A few of these outstanding pictures you may have seen before, but the great majority have never hitherto been published and, altogether, the three books constitute a 1960 Sports-Pix Album that will enable you to re-live, through the winter, a year of splendid, thrill-packed competition.














