Here our engineers operate the very latest computerised processes, while other engineers are engaged full-time on research and development. We've developed our own varieties of polycarbonate and plastics, and even our own fibreglass material. We call this material Steelglass. It's used in the new Kiwi K8 – the helmet worn in Europe by Graeme Crosby and Rolf Biland. Now the K8 is on sale in Australia.

So why did we call a Swiss helmet Kiwi in the first place?

Well, out of 5000 names suggested, our computer told us that Kiwi was easily pronounced in most languages, simple to remember, inoffensive, and completely different to other brand names. How could we argue with that?
