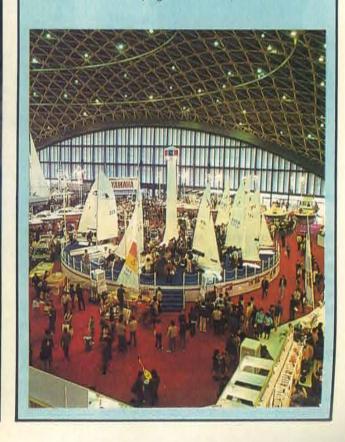


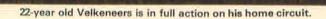

# World Championship Road Racing

# Round 1-Argentine GP

What an exciting start to the '82 season! "King" Kenny on a new YZR500 racer chalked up a magnificent win in the 500cc class of the Argentine GP on March 28. Kenny finished first after a hectic racelong battle with Barry Sheene on another YZR500 and Freddie Spencer on a new 2-stroke Honda racer. It was truly a split second sensation!

New Zealander Graeme Crosby of the Marlboro Agostini Team who also rode a YZR500 racer, led the race for the opening lap, with Kenny, Sheene and Spencer in hot pursuit.

Crosby retired during lap 4 with one cylinder broken, leaving the field to the above high-speed trio. In the meantime, Suzuki ace Randy Mamola whipped his new RG500 racer to regain the lost ground after a poor start. Soon after, however, gear selection trouble sidelined him.

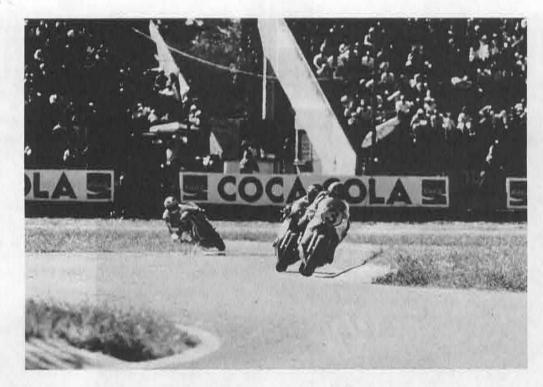
The leading trio continued to thunder almost nose to tail round the tricky 2.47-mile circuit, thus keeping the 25,000 crowd thrilled and excited.

The circuit was very difficult to overtake on but the top position was not so long retained by any one of them.....lap 13 Spencer, lap 14 Kenny, lap 15 Sheene, lap 16 Kenny and so on.

With a few laps to go, Sheene accelerated his Yamaha to pull ahead of the others, especially Kenny.

The battle became more intense during the closing stages of this 32-lap race. The

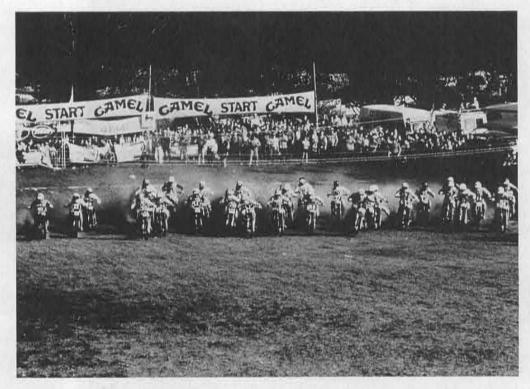
# Velkeneers has the 125cc title in his sights!

# New XT550 performs faultlessly!



From France: An absolutely standard XT550 showed its superbly reliable performance in the eighth annual Le Touquet Beach Enduro Race in Northern France. The XT550 which was ridden by Mitsui U.K. Public Relations Officer, Patrick Wills, performed faultlessly throughout the gruelling three hour race and finished second overall in the Trail Bike Class. This was an excellent debut for this outstanding trail bike.

Le Touquet Beach Enduro Race attracts over 1,200 riders and 200,000 spectators each year and the official entry for the 1982 event was, in fact, an incredible 1,284!

The race is run over a 16-km course on the beach at Le Touquet, an exclusive coastal resort favored by the wealthy. Speeds of over 100 mph are reached by some riders on the 6-km straight which is extremely hard on the bikes as the sea air causes a number of carburetion troubles.

# The powerful Shell/Yamaha racing team

From Brazil: Back in 1980, Shell Oil and Yamaha Motor do Brasil started their joint race activities in Brazil. The primary objective of this cooperation was to attain a common target—development of more economical fuel and more fuel-saving machines. Both companies have already

gained the expected results for the past two years and their cooperation has been more increased for 1982, in order to achieve a higher level of goal by putting even greater efforts in race activities, as follows:

18-year old Antonio Jorge Neto will ride Yamaha TZ250/350 machines in a number of national and international road race events including Copa Brazil. He is one of the most promising riders and showed his superiority by winning five road race championships last year—Copa Brazil, South American Championship, 350cc Brazilian Championship and 350cc São Paulo State Championship.

Brazilian motocross starts, Nivanor Bernardi and Roberto Boettcher will use new YZ125 and YZ250 machines in national and international championship races.

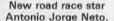
Nivanor and Boettcher who won the 125cc and 250cc São Paulo State Championships respectively last year, are enthusiastic about clinching the titles again.

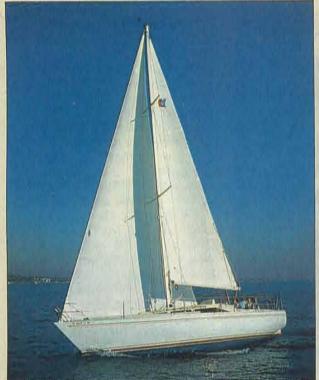

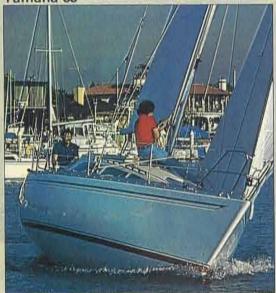

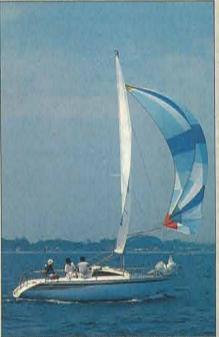

# The 21st Tokyo International Boat Show

From Tokyo: Approximately 70,000 people visited the Tokyo International Boat Show held in the Harumi International Trade Center from March 24 to 28. As in previous years Yamaha occupied the largest display space, and adopted the theme of "New Wave of Marine Life." Numerous brilliant models were put on display under colorful lighting. Among the display were 17 motorboats (ten of which were pleasure fishing boats) including FISH-22II O/B, FISH-15 Custom, Yamaha-14 Seahopper II and Pacific Cruiser-30 Convertible. Also on display were seven sailboats, 16 outboard motors and five diesel engines. In addition to all this, a "marine advice corner" was set up so that people who visited this show could ask questions about getting started in marine life. This idea was conceived to get as many people as possible, aside from boating and sailboating enthusiasts, to better their understanding of marine recreation since interest in marine recreation is growing among the general

During their two week stay in Japan, these officials visited the main office of Yamaha Motor accompanied by Mr. Hoe Boon Meng, the sales manager of Hong Leong Company Pte Ltd., acting as their guide. They stated that they found the visit very worthwhile, receiving advice from the staff at the Yamaha Safe Riding Promotion Center, and touring the Yamaha Technical Center, the authorized motorcycle driving school run by Yamaha.

"We've ordered 10," said Mr. Anderson, "and we expect to sell the lot." He is, needless to say, very excited about the bike."

"As well as the turbo, there will be the XZ550R—a water-cooled, V-twin, double overhead-cam eight valve which absolutely, flies. No one has made a superfast V-twin before, and this one is ultra-high performance—it redlines at 10,000rpm. There is also the XS400R and the XT125, XT200 and XT550 road trail bikes. The XT550 is a whole new concept in engine design—a twin-carb single."

With this wealth of new models joining an already extensive range, it's not hard to see why Perth's Yamaha dealers are excited.

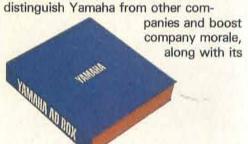

# "AQUACULTURE OF JAPAN"

Aquaculture is one of the most popular coastal fisheries in Japan. It ranks top in terms of output, that is, more than two thirds of Japan's total coastal fishery output come from aquaculture. This means that specific importance is attached to the effective artificial control of aquatic resources, rather than to merely increasing the catch of natural fish, shellfish and seaweed.

This stems from the fact that 1) the stable amount of very fresh aquatic products must be supplied to customers at stable prices, to keep ideal balance between supply and demand, 2) aquaculture facilities and techniques including artificial yielding of "seeds" have been improved, and 3) better rationalization of fishery management must be realized due to declaration by individual nations of a 200 nautical mile fishing zone and a steep rise in oil prices arising out of worsened physical environment and increased importance of resources conservation.
